SCHOOL SECURITY BULLETIN

Many families have been concerned about a woman who has been needlessly loitering in the school parking lot and along Mt. Olive Road. The school is very concerned as well, and as a result, has gotten a temporary restraining order (Mr. Zeisler is returning to court to seek a permanent order on May 20th). The order states that she is to stay 100 yards away from all children from the Park and Walk sign at the Post Office to Chicago Park School, "except as reasonably required to transit the area." She has been seen driving in one of three vehicles: a white Lincoln Town Car LPN# 6WSG675, a silver Honda Passport LPN# 6AUL185, and a green SUV (possibly Ford Explorer, LPN# 4YRE634. If you see this person in the school parking lot or driving very slowly down Mt. Olive Road, please contact the school office immediately or call the Sheriff's Department. Safety of our children will always be a number one priority at Chicago Park School.
