VIRTUAL FIELD TRIP

The second grade made school history by being our first class to attend a virtual interactive field trip to the California Academy of Sciences. The students have been studying penguins and they were able to witness the "live" feeding of a colony of penguins that reside at the Academy in San Francisco. Rochelle, an on-site educational expert, showed videos of penguins in their natural environment and answered the student's questions. And to think, this was all without a three hour drive!

COLD AND FLU SEASON

With the change of weather the cold and flu season is among us. In order to help stop the spread of germs, here are a few things that we will be encouraging and that you can do to help.

- Teach your children to wash their hands often with soap and water or an alcoholbased hand sanitizer. In both instances, children should be taught to rub their hands together briskly since it is this friction that is created that will kill the germs on their hands. When using soap and water, the child should be instructed to also dry his/her hands thoroughly and then properly dispose of the paper towel. When using the hand sanitizer, the child should be instructed to rub his/her hands together until the hands are dry.
- Teach your children not to share personal items like drinks, food or unwashed utensils.
- Cover coughs or sneezes with a tissue. If a tissue is not available, we encourage you to have them sneeze into the elbow, arm or sleeve areas. The tissue should then be disposed of immediately in a proper trash can and then the child should be instructed to wash their hands to remove the germs.
- Know the signs and symptoms of the flu. Symptoms of the flu include fever (100 degrees Fahrenheit, 37.8 degrees Celsius or higher), cough, sore throat, a runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, and feeling very tired. Some people may also vomit or have diarrhea.
- Keep sick children at home for at least 24 hours after they no longer have fever. Do not send children to school if they are sick. Any children who are determined to be sick while at school will be sent home.
