CHROMEBOOKS AT CPS

We are very excited to have 50 Chromebooks available to our students in grades 2-5 (we are looking forward to expanding the number to include every grade level). The purpose of these tablets is to assist teachers in all academic areas of instruction, and for us to have the means to efficiently conduct Smarter Balance Testing in the springtime. The Chromebooks will not be used as an outlet for students to access on-line video games. In fact, students will be instructed to only access pre-approved sites that have been placed on the desktops of the tablets. addition, all students have been instructed on appropriate use of the devices, including washing hands before use, and treating the keyboard in a gentle manner. If a child is abusing the use of any Chromebook, he/she will lose their privilege of use for a pre-determined period.

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT
